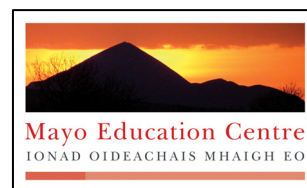
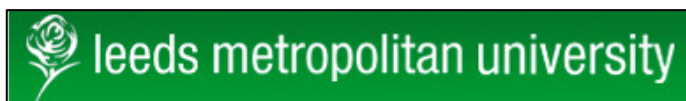

Title: MSc. In Leadership & Management

Year 1- (2) 30 M level credit point modules
2 weekends (Saturday & Sunday) in Mayo Education Centre
1 weekend per semester – each weekend = 1 Module
2 Tutors in Mayo Education Centre from Leeds

Year 2 - (2) 30 M level credit point modules
2 weekends (Saturday & Sunday) in Mayo Education Centre
1 weekend per semester – each weekend = 1 Module
2 Tutors in Mayo Education Centre each weekend - from Leeds

Final Thesis – 60 credit point module
3 weekends (Saturday & Sunday) in Mayo Education Centre
2 Tutors in Mayo Education Centre each weekend - from Leeds

Assessments

Each Module 30

Credits will have a Written assessment of 6000 words (+ / - 5%)
Reflective Practice assessment based on professional practice.
Work designed to assess the ability of a participant to undertake and reflect upon practice as a professional, to synthesise theory and practice, to understand contexts and to evaluate personal practice.

Final thesis

or major independent study based on negotiated title 12,000 – 15,000 words.

Course requirements:

Primary Degree Honours
or Primary Degree Pass with 2-5 years teaching experience.
(finally negotiated with Leeds Met.)

Course Overview

This part-time course, on the Leading Edge Teacher CPD scheme, offers the opportunity for professional development and academic study for teachers and other education professionals working within schools, colleges and related educational settings in a leadership or management role.

This programme was developed in consultation with experienced school leaders, local authority representatives and academic staff. It has been specifically designed to support the professional development of a wide spectrum of teachers, ranging from those preparing for their first leadership role through to those preparing for or already occupying a senior leadership role. Modules have been designed to place participants at the forefront of new and exciting developments in school leadership, focusing on areas such as consultancy and action research methodology.

Demands on teachers' time and the pressures of work/life balance mean that teachers are often obliged to choose between academic programmes of advanced study and professional courses. This programme offers the opportunity, via an assessment-only route, to gain academic credit towards a Masters degree, and credit from these modules as well as taught modules can be put towards a Postgraduate Diploma (120 credit points) or a Masters degree (180 credit points).
