Course Overview

The SEN Unit of the Education Department at St. Angela's College, Sligo in conjunction with Mayo Education Centre are offering an Introductory Course in Special Educational Needs.

This Introductory Course in Special Educational Needs (SEN) aims to meet the needs of Principals, Co-ordinators of SEN, Resource/Learning Support Teachers, Special School/Class Teachers, Mainstream/Subject Teachers, SNAs and other professionals working in primary, post-primary and other educational settings such as Youthreach, Adult Training Centres and the Prison Service, in relation to SEN.

This innovative course has been designed to develop the professional skills required to identify and support pupils with SEN in a variety of situations. It has strong links between current research and the impact this has upon classroom practice.

This 10 hour course is structured to be completed over five nights and on completion, participants will be awarded with a Certificate of Attendance.

Further progression on to the Postgraduate Diploma/Masters in Understanding SEN, or the Postgraduate Certificate/Diploma/Masters in Professional Studies in SEN (subject to validation) is also possible.

This Introductory Course allows exemption from the attendance of some lectures on Module 1 of both Postgraduate programmes.
